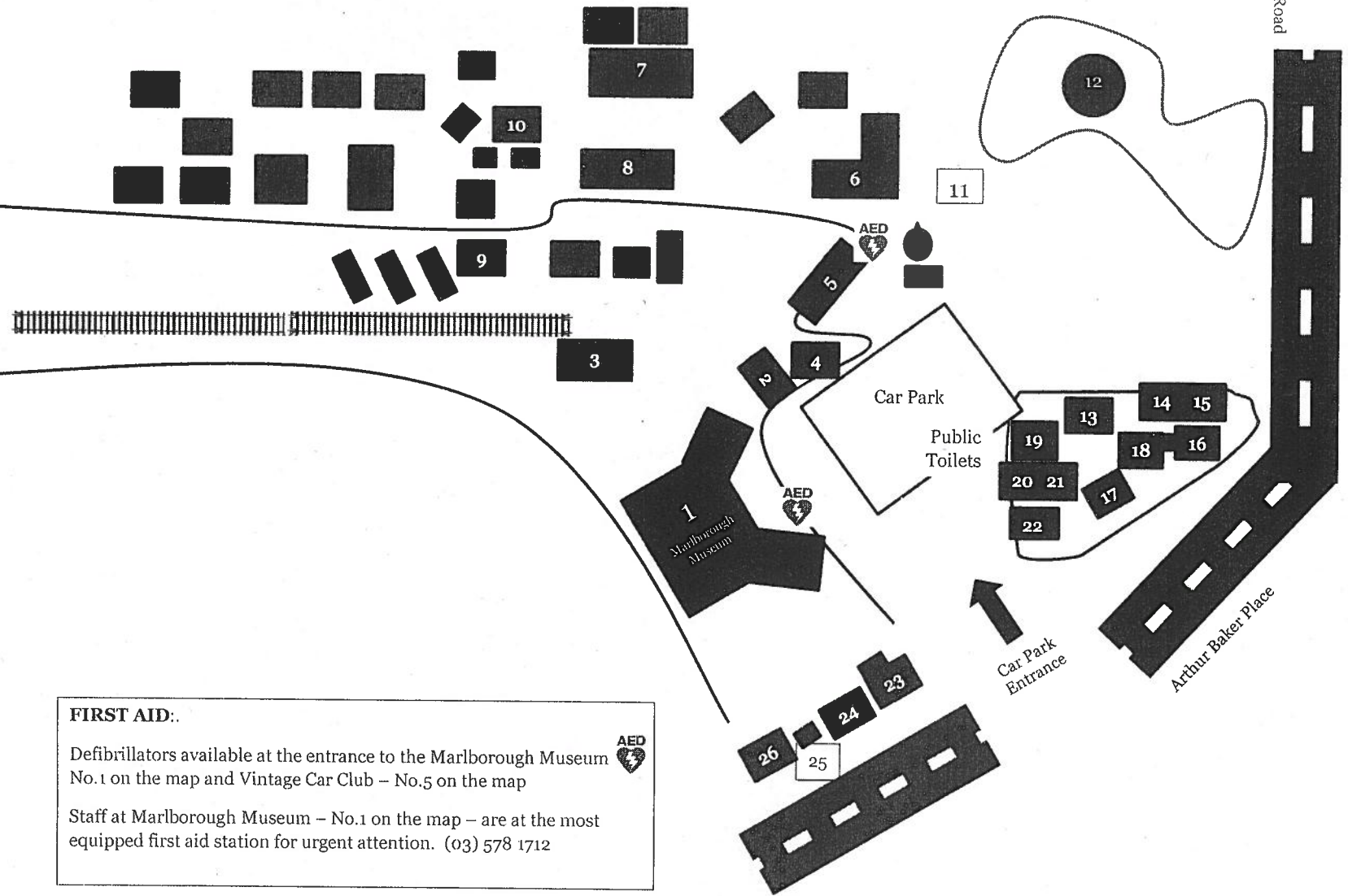

About Brayshaw Park

Brayshaw Heritage Park is named after Norman Brayshaw, a true Heritage Hero of Marlborough. He was instrumental in the formation of the Marlborough Vintage Farm Machinery Society collection. Norman Brayshaw was the Secretary/Treasurer of the Marlborough Historical Society 1960 to 1972. He was an advocate for the establishment of small museums at Renwick, Havelock, and Picton. He also promoted the ship Edwin Fox (1853) as an icon of Marlborough Heritage. His vision had a key role in the establishment of the Park. He died in 1981.
